

Mr. T.S. Drummond, 704 4th Avenue North, Saskatoon, provided this interesting picture for our Remember When series. Taken in 1913 it shows the nearly completed "Marshall Building" on 11th Street West. Grain separators and threshing machines were built there. In later years the building became known as "Derby Motors", and today it still stands as part of the more familiar Intercontinental Packers complex. Contractor for the Marshall Building was Maurice Richards, shown fourth from the right. Perhaps you can identify others in the picture. Waterline pipes for the new building are clearly visible as the line was being put in to serve not only the building in the picture, but were being extended on to the new Government Elevators, according to Mr. Drummond. One of the contractor's sons, G. H. Richards, still resides here, along with two daughters, Mrs. Miller and Mrs. Drummond.
