Annual Gi-normous Garage Sale

It is that time again. April is your **"get ready"** month for the Annual Montgomery Garage Sale held on **Saturday May 05**.

Sale starts at **8:00am** and runs until **5:00pm** (this is what the MCA ad will read in the Star Phoenix and billboard). If your garage sale will be held outside of these hours, then you are encouraged to place your own notice in the Star Phoenix (and elsewhere). If you have not been thinking about it or planning from last year, now is the time. Search your basement for the cobweb-clad items of days gone by. Scrounge in your garage for those items that you keep moving around but never use. Kids, have you got some old toys that you no longer play with; sporting equipment that you have outgrown? Gather it up and put a tag on it.

As mentioned above, the MCA will be posting a billboard at the corner of Dundonald and 11th as well as taking out an ad in the Star Phoenix. You, as garage sale vendors, may want to consider curbside signs (note the city's policy on signage), balloons, and such. Also consider moving your vehicles off-street if possible.

Items to consider for making a better garage sale:

- change (both paper and coin) and price by the quarter dollar;
 - price tags;
 - helpers;
 - used grocery bags to put sold items in for the customer;
 - tunes to make your sale more inviting;
 - a "man-table" strategically placed at the end of your driveway to entice the reluctant male shoppers;
 - kids table (crayons, blank paper, lemonade, stuff to keep the little ones happy);
 - bargain table (items bagged or boxed for sale as a lot/group);
 - consider putting prices on the pieces you are selling; try using colored dot-stickers and then make a chart of the colours and prices;
 - when pricing, a rule-of-thumb is to consider 1/3 of the new price, but consider the age and "leftover usability" of the item as well;
 - if possible, have your sale laid out the night before, as you will have little time in the morning;
- first impressions are still the rule, put**
- your "good stuff" where browsers will see it first; try putting interesting items near the end of your driveway;
 - Items that are not for sale should be put away or clearly marked as "not for sale";
 - If it works, turn it on or at least make sure it can be demonstrated (electrical cord, batteries, etc);
 - tell everyone you know (and strangers on the street) about the garage sale;
 - it is a good idea to have your pets contained during the sale so the excitement does not encourage them to nip or run out in the street.

- if your sale will fall outside the posted times (Saturday from 8:00a.m. – 5:00p.m) you may want to take your own ad in the Star Phoenix.

And don't forget the most important thing, this is supposed to be a fun day for family, friends and neighbors.

Community Watch Report – Illegal Activities

The information below is provided by Saskatchewan Justice Department in connection with their legislation for safer communities.

In any neighbourhood, it only takes one house to harbour illegal activities to undermine the safety of the residents of the community.

What can you do? The Safer Communities and Neighbourhood Act (SCAN) of Saskatchewan gives you a tool to protect your neighbourhood. The SCAN team can improve safety by targeting houses and businesses used for illegal activity and shut them down.

What should I look for in my neighbourhood?

The following is a list of common signs of illegal activity. Any one sign on its own may not necessarily mean drug dealing, drug producing, substance abuse or variety of other illegal activities is occurring on a property. However, frequency of the following list or combination of them may indicate a problem on a property:

- Frequent visitors at all times of day or night
- Frequent late night activity
- Windows blackened or curtains always drawn
- Visitors with expensive vehicles
- Unfriendly people who appear to be secretive about their activities
- People watching cars suspiciously as they pass by
- Strange odours coming from the house or garbage
- Garbage that contains numerous bottles and containers, particularly chemical containers
- Putting garbage out in another neighbour's collection area.

If you suspect illegal activities are occurring in a house or business in your neighbourhood, call SCAN at 1-866-517-2337 to report this. Your report is confidential and you will not have to testify

The Saskatoon Health Region operates a Public Health Services - Dental Clinic in Saskatoon. It is located at West Winds Primary Health Centre at 3311 Fairlight Drive. (665-4261).

Dental treatment and preventive services are provided **free** of charge to children age 4 to 13 years old. To be eligible for services:

- children must live in the Saskatoon Health Region
- have obvious dental problems that require treatment
- have no or limited dental coverage. If the child has some dental coverage we request that parents/guardians bring the dental insurance forms with them to the **first** appointment
