### New Year's Resolutions

#### Job Description for Secretary

Suggested Length of Term Two years  
Job Description To act as overall recorder of the proceedings of the community association.  
Responsibilities

- 1) Records and preserves a record of all the proceedings of all the Board meetings, annual, general, or special meetings.
- 2) Records the attendance of directors at Board meetings.
- 3) Types the minutes and distributes them to the Board of Directors and Leisure Services personnel as soon as possible after the meeting.
- 4) Assists in the preparation and distribution of the agenda prior to the next meeting.
- 5) Makes notification of the next meeting to all Directors, (by phone, written announcement, or minutes of previous meetings).
- 6) Handles all correspondence as directed by the Board of Directors.
- 7) Keeps a record of all committees and committee members.
- 8) Handles the typing and mailing of all correspondence.
- 9) Distributes previous meetings and moves to adopt the minutes as distributes.
- 10) Maintains a file of all correspondence, minutes, agendas, committees, Board members, and a history of the motions.

#### Membership Director

Suggested Length of Term: Two years  
Job Description: Coordinates promotion of the overall memberships of the Community Association  
Responsibilities:

- 1) Responsible for procuring members and collecting membership fees and ensuring these fees are given to the Director of Finance as soon as possible after enrolment.
- 2) Be present where any memberships are sold as at Registration Night and be accountable for money received for the sale of memberships.
- 3) Responsible for ordering and issuing of membership cards upon Board of Director's approval.
- 4) Responsible for organizing all membership drives in the neighborhood in conjunction with the volunteer coordinator.
- 5) Maintains up-to-date lists of members, members' interests and volunteers and resource personnel (to be made available to volunteer Coordinator).
- 6) Makes copies of such lists available to the secretary and to other executive members as necessary.
- 7) Prepares an annual evaluation of membership responsibilities.

#### Social Affairs Director

Suggested Length of Term: Two years  
Job Description: Initiates and organizes social activities for the Community Association members and the neighborhood served by the Community Association.

He/she may assist in the organizing of fund raising activities.

Responsibilities:

- 1) Makes recommendations to the Board of Directors on the holding of social events.
- 2) Responsible for the organization of all social events and meetings where refreshments and entertainment are required.
- 3) Appoints and supervises event coordinators as deemed necessary by the Board of Directors.
- 4) Ensures that community functions are performed along the guidelines set down in the bylaws.
- 5) Prepares an annual financial statement and evaluation of all social events to the Board of Directors.
- 6) Prepares an annual budget for all social activities for the Board of Directors.

#### Soccer Coordinator

If this position is not filled, there will be no outdoor community soccer.

Responsibilities:

- 1) Prepares an annual budget.
- 2) Provides a list of equipment required to the Equipment Manager.
- 3) Assists volunteer recruitment coordinator in recruiting coaches and parent volunteers.
- 4) Sets registration and registration fees.
- 5) Works with the Director of Communication to promote registration.
- 6) Coordinates registration.
- 7) Divies players into teams based on age and ability.
- 8) Books sport facilities.
- 9) Provides players names to coaches and league schedules.
- 10) Submits required information to Minor Sport Organizations.
- 11) Oversees league play.
- 12) Evaluates the complete program.

### GRAFFITI

Graffiti is an act of vandalism that cost hun-  
dreds of thousands of dollars to remove or cover  
every year.

If not immediately removed, graffiti sends out a  
message that "nobody cares" about the area. It  
also causes the area to appear unsafe. This  
creates an open invitation for more littering,  
loitering and more graffiti.

Graffiti is an offence under the Criminal Code of  
Canada and gives police the power to lay  
charges for incidents. In the last year, the  
Saskatoon Police laid 93 charges for graffiti.

What can the community do to help?  
The quick removal of graffiti is the most  
effective means of preventing further acts of  
vandalism. If the graffiti is on private property  
the property owner should remove it within 24  
hours after it appears.

Immediately report all graffiti in progress to  
Saskatoon Police 975-8300.

If graffiti is on your property, you can contact  
the police and have the police take a report,  
they then arrange for photographs to have  
recorded on their Saskatoon Police Tagger  
Tracking database for investigation. Alterna-  
tively, you can take photographs before removal  
and take the information to the police station  
for a report.
