Holiday Safety **Summer Holidays**

Summer vacation is a time for relaxation and enjoyment, but it can also be the time for crime victimization if homeowners don't use appropriate crime prevention measures. It's important for anyone planning a trip, be it a weekend at the cottage, or a few weeks abroad, to adhere to some basic home 'target hardening' principles in order to ensure they return to a secure residence.

When leaving on a trip over the summertime, homeowners should consider the following:

- * Have good locks on all doors and windows and make sure you use them
- * Leave shades and blinds in their normal positions.
- * Ask a neighbour to watch your home while you are away.
- * Leave your contact information with them in case you need to be reached in an emergency.

* Before leaving, test your smoke detectors and if you have one, your home security alarm.

* Make sure you stop all deliveries and have a neighbour or relative pick up your mail, newspapers or any packages.

* Arrange for someone to mow your lawn and maintain your home so that it looks lived in.

* Have a neighbour put out garbage bags in front of your home on garbage day.

* Use timers on your lights and consider using them on a television or radio inside your home.

* Do not announce your absence on your telephone answering machine, leave your normal day-to-day message.

* Ask a neighbour to occasionally park their vehicle in your driveway. If you leave your car at home, leave it in its usual spot. Try to arrange to have it moved occasionally.

* Make sure your garage doors and windows are locked and secured.

* Consider taking valuables to a Bank Safety Deposit box.

Flooding Assistance now available from Provincial Program.

The Province has advised that Saskatoon has been declared an Eligible Assistance Area under the Provincial Disaster Assistance Programs. residents of saskatoon who suffered uninsurable damage from the rainstorm of June 17,

such as water seepage, may now be eligible to receive assistance from the Provincial Program. Claims must be submitted before December 17, 2007 to be eligible, and work must be complete by June 17, 2008. In situation where house cleanup is already under way, The Province asks residents to save samples of damaged articles, document the clean-up process, and take pictures to support the application. The Province will be sending an adjustor to visit eligible claimants, continued on page 2

usually within 30 days upon receipt of their application. For more information please contact the City's Solicitor's Office at 975-3270 or the Provincial Disaster assistance Program at (306) 787-7800.

New Park Hours

The Facilities and Parks Usage Bylaw was amended by City Council on May 28, 2007 to address concerns expressed by residents regarding disruptive activities and gatherings parks during night-time hours. The bylaw now prohibits people from entering or remaining in city parks between the hours of 12:00a.m. and 5:00 a.m. Enforcement will be on a complaint basis, with City Police having the authority to disperse night-time park gatherings and to issue tickets to non-compliance. The closure applies to all neighbourhood and district parks within the City of Saskatoon. Riverbank parks are exempt from the restrictions.

Bylaws restricting night-time use of parks are a common practise in cities across Canada.
