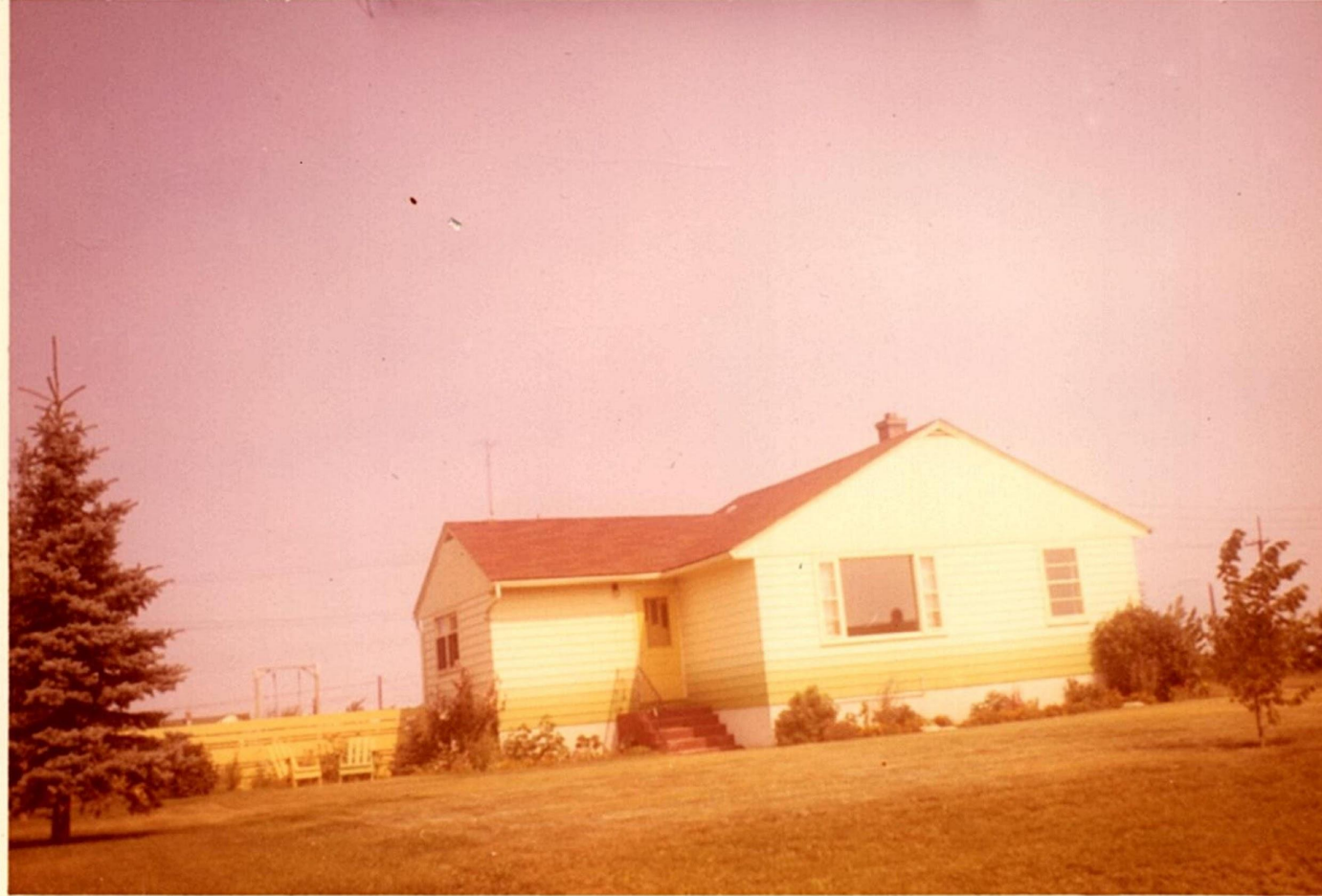

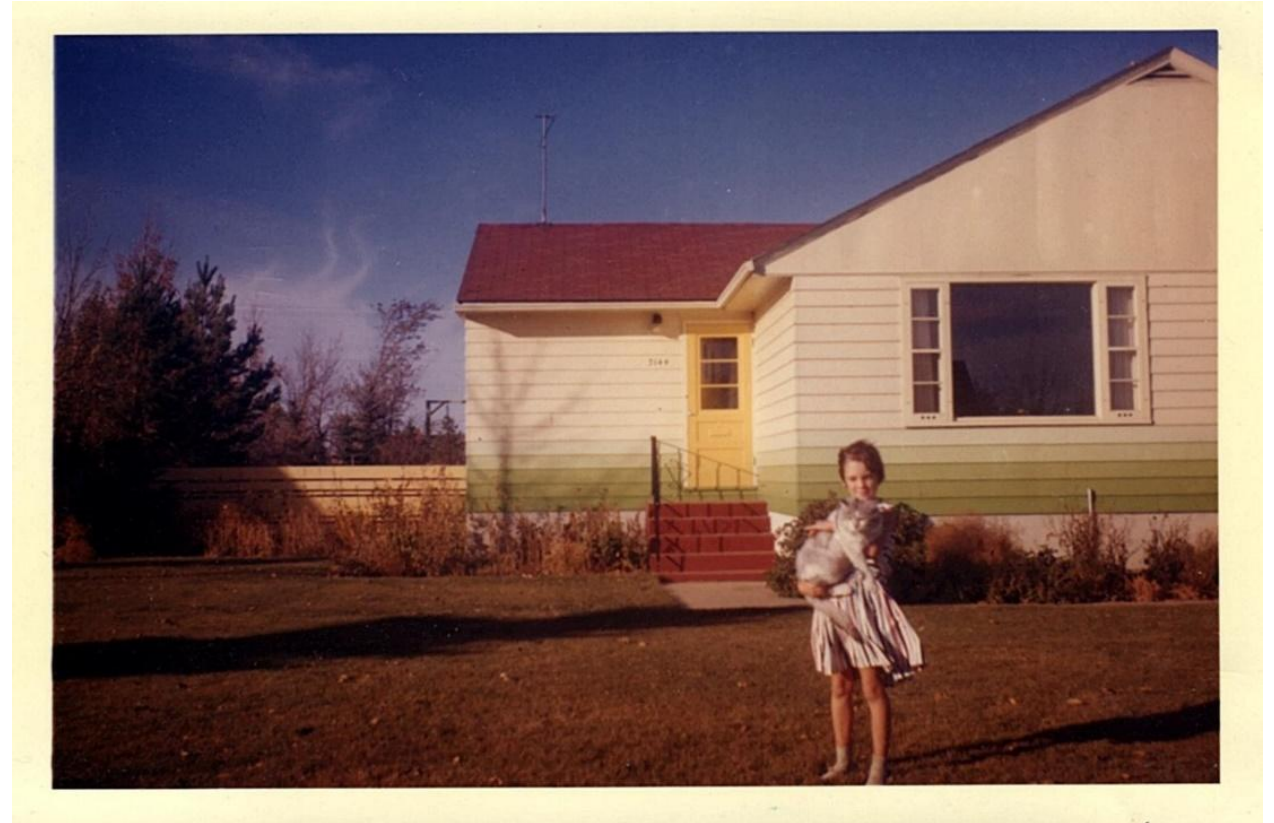

Andrew Charles Suffredine (1925-1979)



War Service of Andrew (Andy) Suffredine

- Andrew was born in Saskatoon on January 28th, 1925 and was educated there before enlisting in the Army on January 7th, 1943 – just before his 18th birthday
- After a period of Basic Training at Dundurn, Saskatchewan, and completing a Signal course, Andrew was posted overseas to England as a Lance Corporal with the Regina Rifles
- Andrew participated in the June 6th, 1944 D-Day Invasion at Juno Beach, Normandy and continued with the Regiment through the European Campaign into Germany until the end of hostilities
- Andrew was awarded the 1939-45 Star, France and Germany Star, C.V.S.M. and Clasp, and the 1939-45 War Medal, and was discharged on April 24th, 1946 at #12 District Depot in Regina
- Andrew passed away on May 5th, 1979 at the age of 54 and is buried in the Veteran's Cemetery at Masset, BC

Mildred Joan Suffredine/Carlson (1922-2018)



War Service of Mildred Suffredine/Carlson (née Round)

- Mildred was born in Toronto on September 2nd, 1922, and lived and worked there until enlisting in the Canadian Women's Army Corp (CWAC) in 1943
- After basic training, Mildred was assigned to coastal defense in Halifax, where she worked as a Gunner in the Gun Operation Room (G.O.R.) located below ground at Citadel Hill
- Mildred was later posted overseas to England, where she did the same type of work
- It was in England that she met her future husband, Andrew, and they later married and settled at Montgomery Place in Saskatoon
- Mildred served with the CWAC from 1943-1946 and remained active in the Royal Canadian Legion until her passing on September 28th, 2018
