

WHAT: Back Lane Reconstruction
WHEN: During the week of September 28, 2026
WHERE: From 1666-1698 Bader Crescent

Each spring, the City of Saskatoon (City) rates the condition of all gravel back lanes to determine the level of maintenance required. Your block was identified for reconstruction in order to address deterioration causing potholes, improper grading, or other issues such as drainage. The work will take approximately **1 day** to complete, weather permitting.

During this project

- Crews with construction equipment will be working in the back lane. The equipment will be removing mud, compacting and shaping the back lane and placing new gravel on the surface.
- Heavy machinery will be used to complete the work and may result in noise or vibration.
- Access to the back lane will be permitted during this work, but delays may be encountered.

How you can help

- Stay clear of the work zone for your safety and the safety of workers.
- Remove all debris and vehicles from the back lane during the work.
- Maintain trees and plants on your property.
- Do not add topsoil or other materials to the back lane or adjust material along your property line to improve drainage.

Common questions



Will black, blue, or green cart collections be affected as a result of this work?

Residents directly adjacent to the work area are required to leave their carts outside of the work area prior to 7am on the day of collection. The contractor will coordinate the pickup of your cart.



Will there be traffic and street/driveway access restrictions?

There will be restrictions adjacent to the work area while this maintenance takes place. Signs will be posted after 6 AM on the day of work and traffic will be detoured as required.



Will parking be affected?

For homes and businesses adjacent to the work area, access to on street parking may be restricted. For residents with mobility requirements please contact us.



Will water and sewer service be affected?

If your water services are turned off, households/businesses will experience disruptions to their water services followed by the issuance of a yellow Drinking Water Advisory, advising residents to boil their water prior to ingesting until laboratory results confirm the water is safe to drink.



Will bus routes change?

Bus routes within the construction area may be affected. Please watch for signs posted for alternate bus stops or use the mobile app called 'Transit' for real-time bus information.
